




Somewhat Rare in Alberta but have been found near Wabasca recently





Segment 19



Fronts are $3 \frac{3}{4}$ " – $5 \frac{3}{4}$ " long by $2 \frac{7}{8}$ " – 5" wide.

The negative space between the toes and the heel pad forms an H.

Rears are $3 \frac{3}{4}$ " – $5 \frac{1}{4}$ " long by $2 \frac{5}{8}$ " – $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " wide.

The negative space between the toes and the heel pad forms an X. Overall, hinds are narrower and more oval shape than the front.
